ZIMBABWE BOOK A PLACE IN THE FINAL

ZIMBABWE have now trounced the West Indies twice. And the thousands of home supporters ready to cheer on their heroes at Old Trafford will be hoping that now Andy Flower's team have secured their place in next Saturday's NatWest Series Final, they may relax.

But the African side will not - and the Flower brothers, plus Johnson, Campbell and Co will be out to complete a dashing double over England. The tourists made easy work of the hosts when the sides met at The Oval last Saturday. Marcus Trescothick's hugely-impressive 79 on debut was not enough to make up for drab performances by other, more senior players.

Now Zimbabwe - buoyed by the 70-run whipping of the Windies at Canterbury on Tuesday, will be out to scuttle England's big batting names again. Neil Johnson led the wicket-taking exploits against Jimmy Adams' side, with two for 16 off six overs. Five other bowlers also chipped in with a wicket-apiece.

England will be hoping to banish memories of their sorry batting performance against the Windies at Lord's on Sunday, when only torrential rain saved them after collapsing to 158 for eight.

Trescothick's 49 and Graham Thorpe's 42 offered some cheer for supporters at the home of cricket, but assistance from more

batsmen will be required to set the Africans a decent target.

But England should beware, as Johnson, Guy Whittall and Campbell are fresh from big innings against the West Indies - and no doubt hungry for more runs.

10th July at Canterbury Zimbabwe beat West Indies by 70 runs

SIX DAYS, three wins, and Zimbabwe are already in the NatWest Series Lord's final before England and West Indies have even began to stir in the inaugural mid-summer tournament.

The Canterbury outfield was slowed by the recent rain, and Zimbabwe struck only 50 runs in boundaries out of their total of 256 for four and made certain they galloped the rest.

It could be argued that vital runs were literally handed to them by crucial lapses in a sub-standard West Indies fielding display in which seven chances went astray.

Perhaps the most crucial was offered by Alistair Campbell, who was five when Ridley Jacobs should have stamped him off Chris Gayle and he went on to make an influential 77 not out off 78 balls to add to his man-of-the-match 80 against England at The Oval on Saturday.

The Windies played some loose strokes, and a run-out between captain Jimmy Adams and Brian Lara had West Indies tottering on the edge of the precipice at 40 for five.

Jacobs owed his side some runs and made 37 before falling lbw to Grant Flower in the 43rd over after a stand of 54 with Nixon McLean, who went on to complete 50 from 70 balls before West Indies ended the match at 186 for eight.

To start with, Gayle clipped a catch to square-leg, then Sherwin Campbell mishit a shot to mid-on, and Wavell Hinds knocked back a return chance to Bryan Strang.

It was 23 for three and worse was to follow when Adams and Lara ended up at the same end, and next ball Lara played on to a pacy delivery from Heath Streak.

Zimbabwe were led by 83 in 111 balls from Guy Whittall in his 100th international after Neil Johnson had struck a bristling 51 in 68 deliveries.

Hinds failed to grasp the difficult chance offered by Johnson on 17 and then came the fluffed stumping opportunity by Jacobs off Campbell.

Man-of-the-match Whittall, too, was let off on 40, 49 and 80 by Rose, Sherwin Campbell and Hinds after a treble-juggle.

Jimmy Adams

"It was a bad performance in every aspect. Our approach in the field was very poor. Nobody is happy with the way we fielded. We might have bowled a little better in the second half of the Zimbabwe innings than we did in the first. And we didn't bat very well and my run-out came at a very bad time for the team. We haven't been very happy with the way things have gone since the Lord's Test. It's a very big challenge for us to use the time remaining between now and the two games in Durham, and see we can get ourselves back on track, not so much technically but mentally."

Nixon McLean

Nixon McLean's half-century was a determined effort to restore some pride in the West Indies' performance. McLean's runs were fashioned from 70 balls, including three fours. Batting at number nine, the bowler was far more at home at the wicket than his upper order colleagues, and his top-scoring performance will have shamed the likes of Wavell Hinds and Brian Lara.

"We would have fielded had we won the toss and we would have liked to have chased. Things worked out very well for us from the word go. Guy Whittall had the guts to stand up and say he'd like to open when Craig Wishart injured his knee just before the start, and he did a great job. To be honest our fielding was great today and I'd like us to sharpen up on that. We are not used to doing this well and it's a great feeling for the boys. Who we play in the final is out of our hands, so we won't bother about it. We haven't won a major tournament but we got into the final against India in Sharjah and lost. The impact of playing this sort of cricket and getting a few wins under our belt has been huge back home."

Alistair Campbell missed out on the man of the match award, but his rapid 77 was as important as Whittall's contribution. 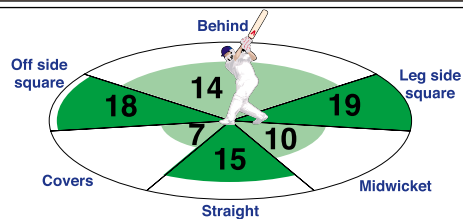

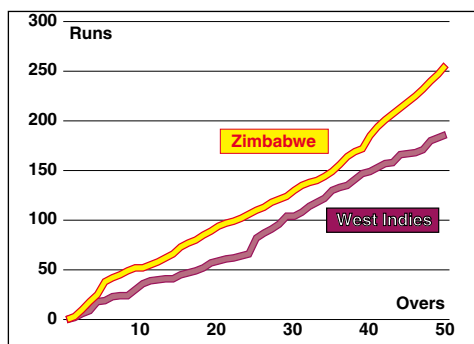

NATWEST SERIES – HOW IT WORKS

- All matches will consist of one innings per side and each innings will be limited to 50 overs. A minimum of 25 overs per team shall constitute a match.
- Matches shall be of one day's scheduled duration with the exception of the final, for which a reserve day has been allocated in case of weather interruption.
- In matches without a reserve day there is provision for up to 60 minutes of extra official playing time in day matches and up to 30 minutes in floodlit matches to make up for time lost.
- Play is scheduled to start at 10.45am with an interval of 45 minutes at 2.15pm and close of play at 6.30pm.
- At floodlit matches play is scheduled to start at 2.30pm with an interval of 45 minutes at 6pm and close of play at 10.15pm.
- Two drinks intervals, each one hour and 10 minutes apart, are permitted for each innings.
- Where play is delayed or interrupted the umpires will reduce the length of the interval between innings. If up to 60 minutes are lost the interval will be reduced to 30 minutes. If between 60 and 120 minutes are lost the interval will be reduced to 20 minutes. If more than 120 minutes are lost the interval will be reduced to 10 minutes.
- The innings of the team batting second shall not commence before the scheduled time unless the team batting first has completed its innings at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled interval. In such circumstances a 10-minute break will occur, the team batting second will commence its innings and the interval will occur as scheduled.
- At the instant of delivery there may be not more than five fieldsmen on the leg side.
- For the first 15 overs only two fieldsmen are permitted to be outside the field restriction marking at the instant of delivery. This restriction will be lifted earlier in circumstances where the number of overs is reduced.
- No bowler shall bowl more than 10 overs in an innings. In a delayed or interrupted match where the overs are reduced no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed.
- A no ball will be called for short-pitched bowling. The penalty will be one run plus any runs scored.
- Umpires have been instructed to apply a very strict and consistent interpretation in calling wides. The penalty will be one run plus any runs scored.
- Teams will wear coloured clothing and use white balls manufactured by Duke.
- Teams will play each other three times in the group stage and score two points for a win and one point for a tie or no result.
- If the scores in a match are level the result shall be a tie and no account shall be taken of the number of wickets that have fallen.
- The top two teams in the group will contest the final. In the event of teams finishing on equal points the right to play in the final will be decided according to: The most wins in the group matches. The team that won the most matches between the tied sides. The team with the higher run rate. The team that has taken the higher number of wickets per balls. In the event that teams are still level they will draw lots.

THE DUCKWORTH/LEWIS SYSTEM

The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left. With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team have 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:

- 1) For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available.
 - 2) If team B have less resources available than team A, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team B's revised target is obtained by scaling down team A's score by this ratio.
 - 3) If team B have more resources available than team A, calculate the amount by which team B's resources exceeds team A's.
- Work this out as a percentage of 225 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team A's score to give team B's target.
